

MAQ become member of CAPA

The CAPA was founded more than 30 years ago to promote the preservation of the historic aircraft and the aviation heritage of Canada. Its mission is also to preventing the export of Canada's unique aeronautical heritage. CAPA also provides a means for aviation museums in Canada to communicate with each other regarding similar opportunities and challenges. In this way, it promotes the exchange of material and the sharing of documentation. The non-profit organization is based in Wetaskiwin, Alberta.

MAQ management is pleased to join Canada's nation aviation museum organization as it moves forward with its development plans. This recognition gives MAQ the necessary legitimacy to interact with other Canadian institutions focused on the long-term preservation and display of our shared aeronautical heritage. In 2020, MAQ also obtained its charitable status from the Canada Revenue Agency. This allows the museum to issue tax deductible receipts for any donations received.

In 2021, the MAQ will begin the restoration of an Avro CF-100 Canuck jet fighter built in the late 1950s that was used by Pratt & Whitney Canada to flight test its first turbofan engine.
